A Message of Hope and Gratitude

As we approach the end of 2020, we reflect on the many challenges this year has brought to the whole world. Death, uncertainty, economic issues, racial tensions, natural disasters...the list goes on and on. You know all of this because this information has filled our lives through news broadcasts, social media, direct mail, etc. Some people have said that we are in a hopeless situation. Some see a better day in the future.

In the midst of all of this chaos, Animals in Distress has steadfastly gone about saving lives. We have had to cancel or modify many events and practices, but we never lost sight of our responsibility to save the lives of the most desperate and hopeless animals. Excuses aren't acceptable when lives are on the line. Broken bones and broken hearts can be healed, IF we never lose sight of our goals.

For example, we rescued a kitten who had been hit by a car. The poor kitten was terribly traumatized, and appeared to have suffered head and brain damage. When we first saw it (see picture at left), it was lying lifeless—and hopeless—having

abandoned any thought of being able to move or run away. The kitten was rushed to the vet for treatment. The kitten was named Melissa after the kind woman who rescued the kitten off the road. Several tense days went by, while Melissa's body responded to the supportive treatment she was getting. She wasn't eating, we thought possibly because of an injured or broken jaw, so she was syringe fed. It appears that she had suffered a fractured skull, broken nose, and gash in her chin. Gradually, she stabilized enough so we could bring her back to the shelter, where she continues to recuperate. She is very scared yet but knows that we are trying to help her.

Or there is a litter of kittens and their mother (pictured at left AFTER she was recovering), covered in tar. The poor mother was pregnant and sought refuge in a body shop. Imagine how desperate a mother (whether human or animal) becomes when she has to provide not only for herself but for her offspring. Workers at the body shop did what they could but the tar

was embedded in their fur, so they reached out for help. The mother cat, was named Mamma Mia, was in the worst



shape. Her thigh was encased in the tar. When the fur was shaved, a big open gash was discovered underneath. It had to be sutured. She and her 6 babies are now safe and recovering at Animals in Distress.

And then there's Manny, a dog adopted from us in 2008. The dog had been taped inside a container and abandoned. He was adopted in 2008. However, his owner can no


longer care for him so he is back where he started. Our adoption process includes a firm commitment to every animal we place: if the owner cannot take care of the adopted animal, it must come back to us. That animal will never be homeless or unwanted again. That is a huge commitment for any organization. We contacted some volunteers who knew Manny when he was residing with us, hoping Manny would adjust better if he recognized a friend from the past. One of them had taken Manny through our Canine Good Citizen Class back in 2007, before Manny was adopted, and had always kept Manny in his heart. After introducing Manny to his two other AID dogs, to make sure they were all compatible, the volunteer took Manny home.

The list of stories goes on and on, well beyond the length of hundreds of newsletters. However, the point is this: YOU make these rescues possible. Your support and prayers make our work possible. As George Bailey learns in the holiday movie favorite It's a Wonderful Life, a person is never poor or hopeless as long as he or she has friends. Thank you for being our friend. Thank you for caring about those forgotten by others.

As you approach the holidays, please know that you are in our hearts and our prayers. Take great satisfaction in knowing that YOU have helped save lives, YOU have offered hope and a second chance, to those abandoned by others.

Despite the chaos around us, we can choose Love, Hope, and Peace. We can believe in the ability to do something worthwhile and life saving, IF we remember that TOGETHER we can write happy endings to sad stories.


