Again, let's remember that *a rescue has no guaranteed conclusion*. Those masses could have been cancer, or some other life-threatening condition, and we would have been faced with that challenge.

What should we have done for her? Answer: everything possible What would you have done for her? Well, we are so happy to report to you that all the biopsies came back negative. Luna now has a chance to enjoy the years ahead of her. We will make certain that she only goes into a loving home when she is adopted. And if no one is willing to adopt her, then she will stay with us, and be treated with love and compassion and kindness. We are certain she has never known any of those for very much of her life.
